

Year 6 Home Learning Week Beginning 18th January

Each day, there are four hours of activities -

One hour of maths, one hour of English, one hour of topic and one hour of 'self-directed study' (a choice of activities - some ideas are given, but you might have others!).

You don't need to send us anything to show what you have done for the self-directed study, but you can if you want - it could be a photo of a cake you baked or a review of a book you read for example, Do keep a record of what you have done though, as we will be talking about it in the meetings during the week.

ENGLISH LESSON 1 LO: to read and understand classic fiction This week we are beginning some work based on Oliver Twist, a classic book written in 1838 by Charles Dickens. You need to read the information on the slides. If you are using an ipad or phone, you may need to download google slides first. It includes a short clip from the well known musical film 'Oliver' which was based on Dickens' novel. Then read the extract from Chapter 2 'In the Workhouse' and answer the questions on the Google doc. Use the answer sheet to mark it before turning it in.	<i>Turn in the completed, marked comprehension (with corrections if necessary)</i>
TOPIC LESSON 1 LO: to learn about the Victorians Watch the video and complete the task at the end of these Slides. There is also a video you can watch when you are in 'Present' mode. If you are unable to open the slides, the task is to annotate a drawing of Victorian Newark with what the places are today. A worksheet is available in the materials if you would like to print that out instead.

Practise writing in a Victorian style then create a "Sampler" which shows off your Victorian handwriting.	<i>A picture of your sampler which must include the alphabet in a Victorian handwriting and a pretty border.</i> <i>Attach a photo as a 'file'</i>
