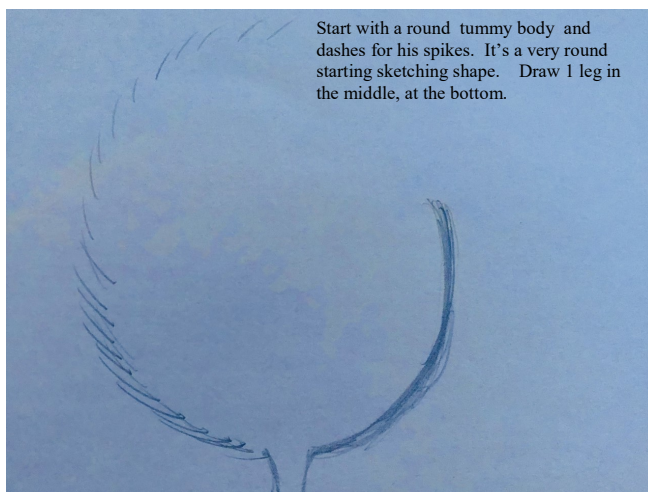
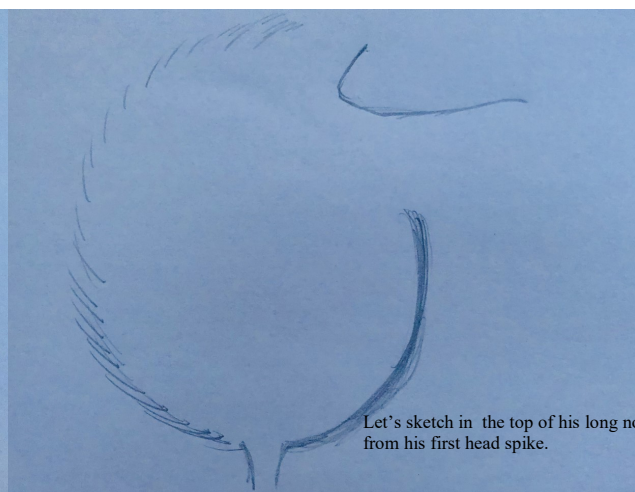
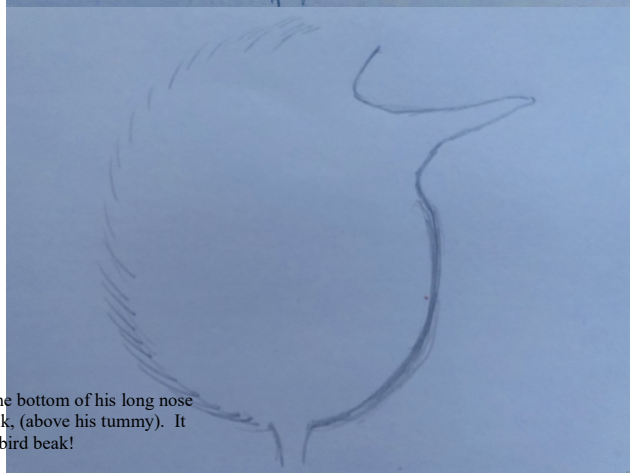




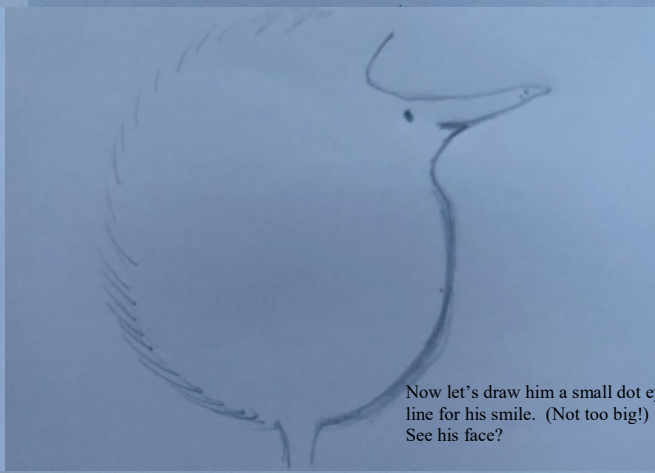
Start with a round tummy body and dashes for his spikes. It's a very round starting sketching shape. Draw 1 leg in the middle, at the bottom.



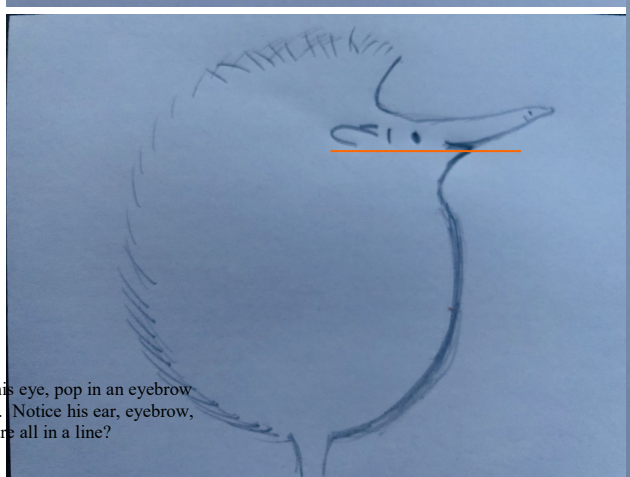
Let's sketch in the top of his long nose from his first head spike.



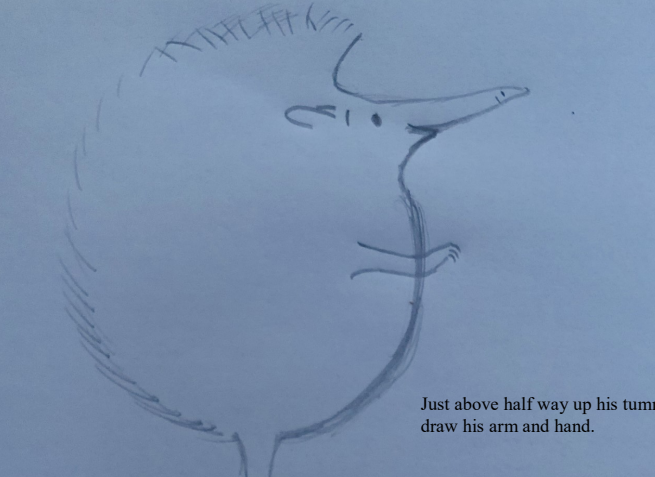
And make the bottom of his long nose meet his neck, (above his tummy). It looks like a bird beak!



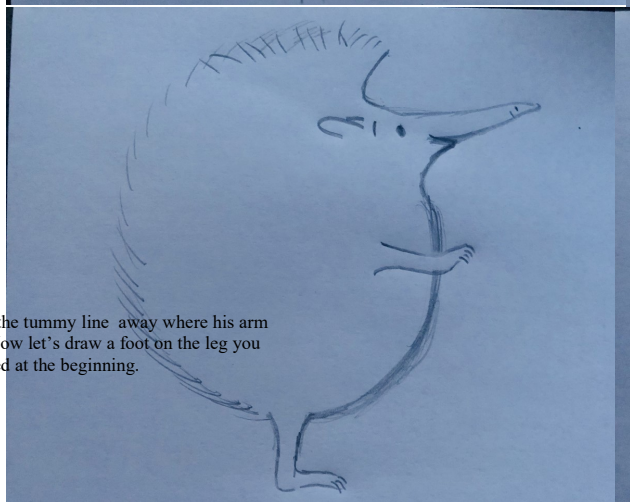
Now let's draw him a small dot eye and a line for his smile. (Not too big!) See his face?



To the side of his eye, pop in an eyebrow and then an ear. Notice his ear, eyebrow, eye and smile are all in a line?



Just above half way up his tummy, let's draw his arm and hand.



Rub the tummy line away where his arm is. Now let's draw a foot on the leg you started at the beginning.



Draw the second leg and foot in behind, making it just a bit longer than the first.

Now he just needs his spike details sketching in with long and short strokes from his ear—to his feet.



Finish him by adding in long and short spike strokes. Start from his body, and push out.

Well done! Are you happy with your Hedgehog? Is he ready for some colour? Will you use paints, crayons or felt-tips? I think the illustrator uses watercolours. Shades of browns, black and pinks are used to paint in his spikes. Notice some are longer and some are as short as dots.
