Can you create a background, cut and stick or draw your own animals in Eric Carle's 'simple' style to make a rainforest scene in an Eric Carle fashion?

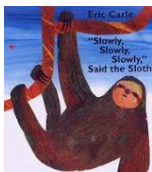
Send a PHOTO of you with any cuddly rainforest animal from home.
