Oranges

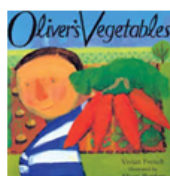

They loved looking at the books and listening to some new stories.

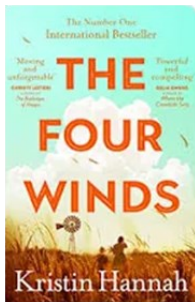


SPOTLIGHT
